## One Burlington County Ticket Wins \$30,000

Mega Millions Jackpot Rolls to \$124,000,000

**TRENTON (July 22, 2020)** – There was **one third-tier prizewinning ticket** sold for the Tuesday, July 21, drawing that matched four of the five white balls and the Gold Mega Ball drawn winning the \$10,000 prize. The ticket was purchased with the Megaplier option, multiplying the prize to **\$30,000**. That ticket was purchased at Township News Center, 2506 Mount Holly Rd., Burlington in Burlington County.

In addition to the third-tier prize won, **20** players matched four of the five white balls drawn making each ticket worth **\$500**. Three of those tickets were purchased with the Megaplier option, multiplying the prizes to **\$1,500**. Moreover, 27,730 other New Jersey players took home \$109,984 in prizes ranging from \$2 to \$600. The winning numbers for the Tuesday, July **21**, drawing were: **14, 25, 26, 41, and 43**. The **Gold Mega Ball** was **15**, and the **Megaplier Multiplier** was **03**.

The next drawing will be held Friday, July 24, at 11:00 pm. All New Jersey Lottery Mega Millions tickets must be purchased before 10:45 pm to participate in the drawing. Mega Millions tickets cost just two dollars; by adding the Megaplier option for an extra dollar per play, players can increase their non-jackpot winnings up to five times. Mega Millions tickets are sold in 46 participating jurisdictions. Drawings are held on Tuesdays and Fridays.
